⁴ Limited English Proficient (LEP) individuals, according to the government’s current definition, “have a limited ability to speak, read, write or understand the English language.” This has been traditionally measured as the ability to speak English less than very well. The Director of the Census determines limited English proficiency based upon information included on the long form of the decennial census. The long form asks respondents whether they speak a language other than English at home, and those that do are asked to evaluate their own English proficiency by choosing one of the four answers provided to the question of how well they speak English – “very well,” “well,” “not well,” or “not at all.”

The Census Bureau has determined that **most respondents overestimate their English proficiency** and therefore, those who answer other than “very well” are deemed LEP.
